Our School Ambassadors will help to choose a winner from each class who will receive a prize and certificate!

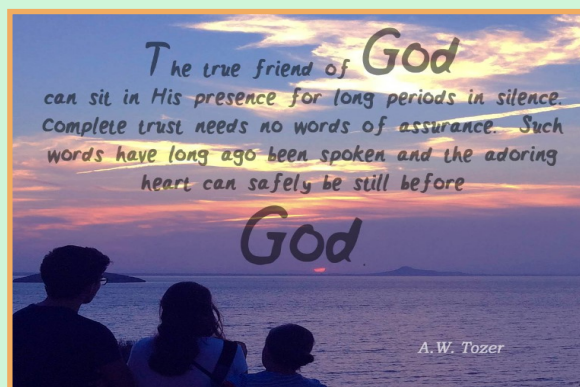
COLLECTIVE WORSHIP
