Road Safety

I am pleased to inform you that work to create a safer place to cross North Street will begin during half term. Dorset Council will be starting work on North Street to create a build out where the school crossing patrol used to be. The plans have been drawn up by Dorset Council following concerns raised by our Road Safety Officer, our Parish Council, parents and residents after the school crossing patrol was withdrawn. The work will involve building out the pavements on North Street which will enable people crossing the road to see past the parked cars and make the road narrower and easier to cross. The scheme will also make visibility better for motorists entering North Street from West Hill near the village hall.
