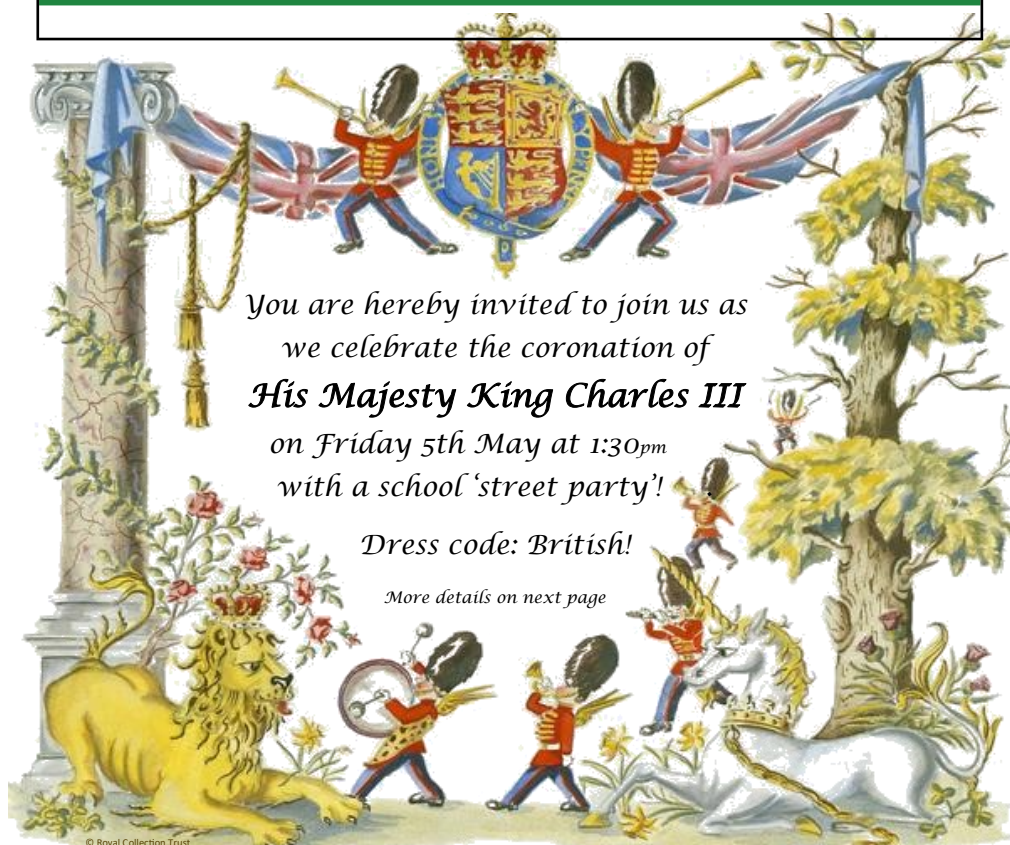
Note from Mr Homer

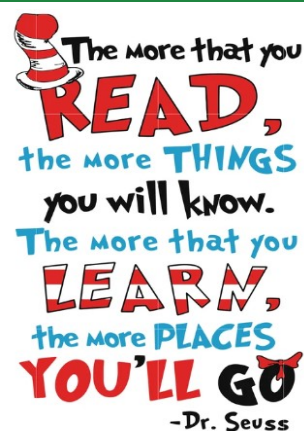
Our school attendance for this academic year is currently:
